RULE 202. TRANSFER

(Adopted 1-19-70; and Revised 3-21-2001.)

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PART 1 GENERAL

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this Rule is to establish provisions that specify that permits are non-transferable except by the District.

1.2 Applicability

The provisions of this Rule shall apply to all District Permit holders.

1.3 Exemptions

This Rule, as most recently revised, is effective on March 21, 2001.

3.1 Permits are Non-Transferable

An Authority to Construct or Permit to Operate shall not be transferable, by operation of law or otherwise, either from one location to another, from one piece of equipment to another, or from one person to another, except as allowed for by District Rule 300.

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
